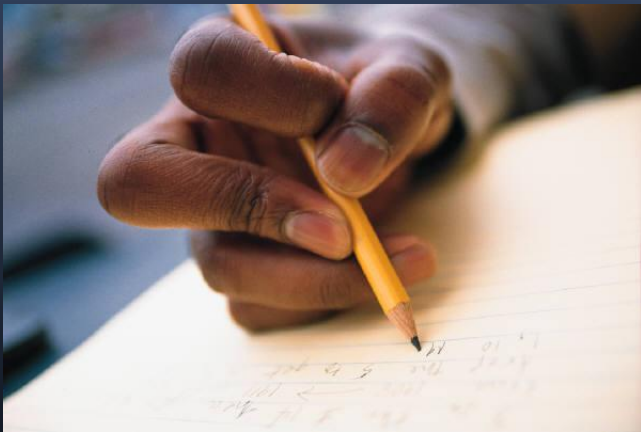

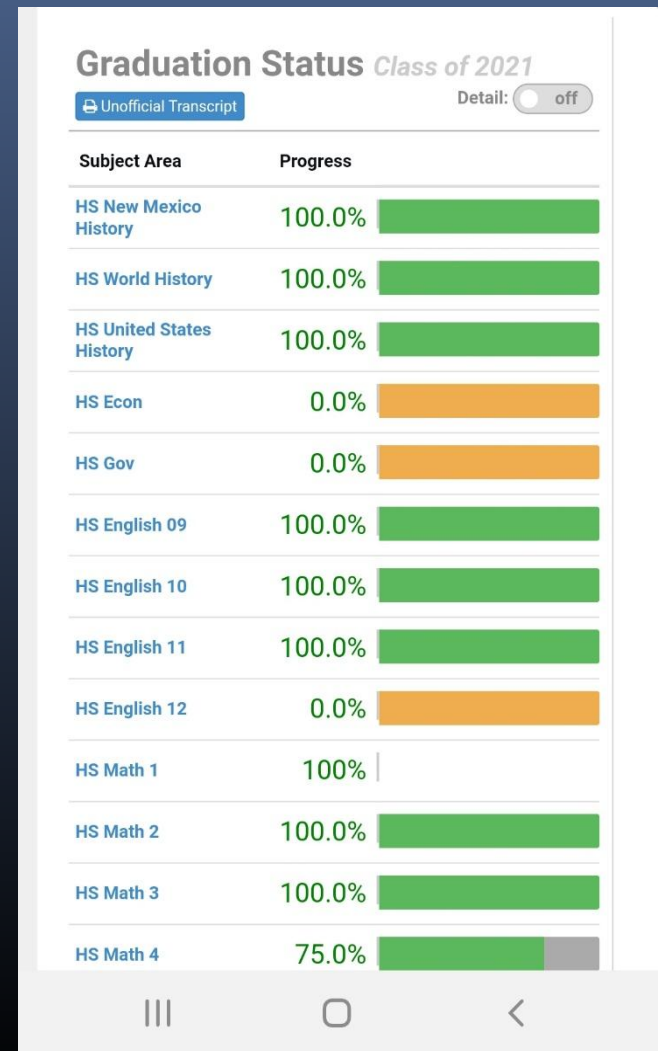

Finish this year strong!

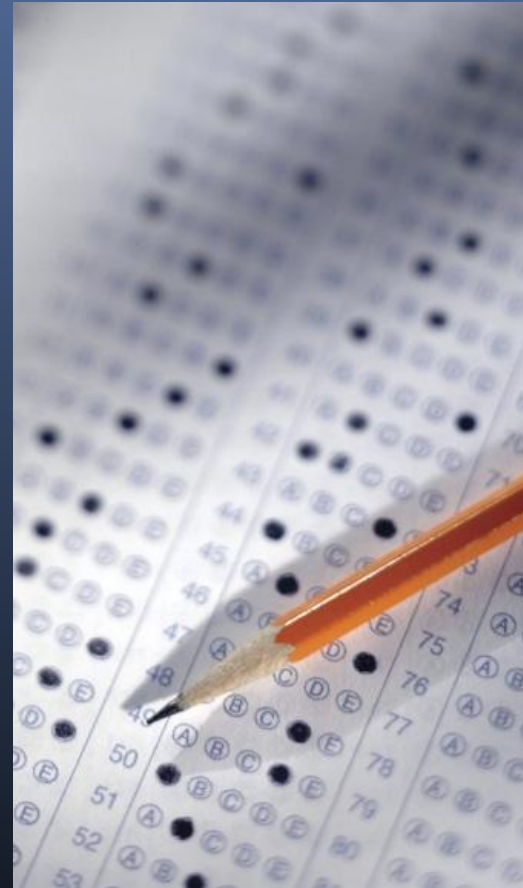
TESTING in High School

- ACCUPLACER- for CNM
- ASVAB- Career Inventory

As part of the graduation requirements, you must show proficiency in Math, Reading, Science, Writing and Social Studies

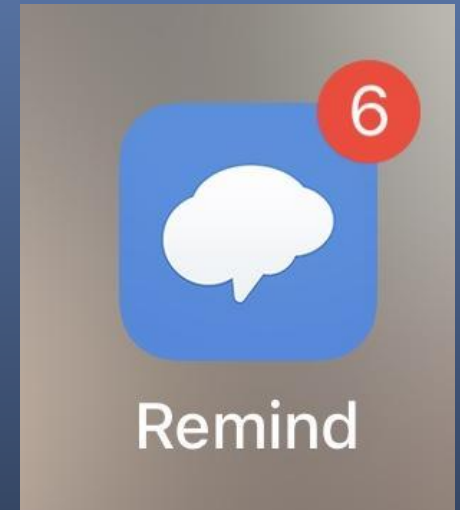

College Planning 101

3 steps

(it really is that simple!)

1. Take a placement Test-
ACCUPLACER, ACT or SAT?
2. Apply to schools (recommend 5-10)
3. Apply for Financial Aid



Is community college right for you?

2-year school (community college)

3 different tracks

1. Courses and certificates in specific trades
2. Associate degrees (2-year degrees)
3. Transfer programs – you take 1-2 years of courses at the Community College and then transfer to the 4-year college

- FAFSA is the FREE APPLICATION for FEDERAL STUDENT AID
 - Go to fafsa.gov to get to the correct application
- Opens Oct 1st- don't start before or you will be doing the wrong one

NM Lottery Scholarship

- All NM public post-secondary institutions participate
- Must be a resident of New Mexico
- Must graduate from an accredited NM high school
- Enroll in the immediate semester after graduating from high school
- First semester of college must have 15 credits with a minimum 2.5 GPA
- Lottery applies for 8 consecutive semesters for tuition only
- Must maintain 2.5 gpa

NCAA- PLANNING TO PLAY SPORTS IN COLLEGE?

- It is your responsibility to meet the eligibility requirements!
- Counselors can help advise you if you are not sure on how to meet those requirements
- You should also work with college coaches and compliance officers
- Make sure you register with NCAA on the Eligibility Center <https://web3.ncaa.org/ecwr3/> and send them your transcript through Parchment

SUMMER after 11th grade:

- Do a credit check
- If an athlete, register with NCAA clearinghouse
- Summer school if needing credit recovery
- Check Senior Schedule
- Work, volunteer or participate in a camp or summer program
- Visit and tour college campuses
- Create a resume/ complete personal profile form
- Check application dates
- Narrow your college list to 5-10
